

## **BRITONS TAKE £268 MILLION FROM LLOYDS TSB CASH MACHINES OVER BANK HOLIDAY WEEKEND**

During the bank holiday weekend, over £268 million was withdrawn from the 4,200 Lloyds TSB Cashpoint® machines all over the UK with the busiest cash machines at seaside resorts, tourist hot spots and railway stations.

The most hectic time at Lloyds TSB cash machines was Friday 26 August when there were nearly 1,000 withdrawals per minute with most people taking out around £70. Saturday was slightly quieter with 840 withdrawals per minute averaging £60. On Sunday and Monday, the amount of money taken out dropped slightly with withdrawals averaging between £50 and £60.

The busiest Cashpoint machines over the bank holiday weekend were:

- Newquay in Cornwall
- Dartmouth in Devon
- Covent Garden and Butler Place in London
- Kings Cross railway station
- Leeds railway station

Matthew Timms, ATM director, Lloyds TSB said: “This weekend was one of the busiest we’ve seen which re-enforces the importance of easy access to cash whether you’re surfing in Newquay or clothes shopping in Covent Garden. None of our ATMs charge a fee and with over 4,000 across the country there’s always one nearby to get cash, check your balance and even top up your mobile phone.”
